*[Psalm 119:89-90](#)*

When the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth 400 years ago, their stated purpose was to advance the Gospel of Jesus Christ. A quest for religious freedom compelled them and their journey was dangerous. There were great challenges to be faced.

In 1622 when they gathered for their second Thanksgiving observance, their meal began with five kernels of corn. It was a reminder of their "starving time". It was tribute to the fact that not one had died of starvation.
