

Even though Amendment 3 (A-3) did not have the outcome at the polls we desired. I am thankful for a pastor who took a stand for the unborn. I am also thankful for a church that voted their faith values. A-3 was approved. but not overwhelmingly. When you look at the map that shows voting outcomes for A-3, by far the greatest number of Missouri's counties voted no. The only areas that carried A-3 were Columbia, St. Louis, and Kansas City.

We have work to do, church. I believe the farreaching consequences of A-3 has served as a wakeup call for Missouri believers. The Scriptures make it clear that it is God's people who hold the key to revival and our land being healed. "If my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked wavs, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land" 2 Chron 7:14).

I am also thankful that this was a mostly positive national election for people of faith. One party has alarmingly set itself against our First Amendment and the freedoms of speech and religion that are guaranteed therein. There was increasing government weaponization against people of faith.
